Current Concerns:

RCMP Detachments are currently seeking information in relation to "Highway" Racing or "Street" Racing, which is an unsanctioned and illegal form of auto racing that occurs on a public roadway.

Suspicious or Unusual Activity

If you come upon non-emergent suspicious activity or an unusual situation, after the fact, such as vandalism, recently broken doors or windows on houses and outbuildings, abandoned vehicles etc.; please contact the RCMP non-emergency line at 204-467-5591.

In progress incidents of an Emergent Nature

Please call 911 immediately if you are witness to incidents of an emergent nature, including.

- Break and enter and attempted break and enter
- An unidentified individual looking into building or vehicle windows
- Incidents that require medical attention
- Vandalism in progress
- Vehicle thefts
- An individual in an unusual location who appears intoxicated or disoriented
- An unidentified vehicle driving slowly or aimlessly in an area
- An unidentified vehicle frequently encountered in an unusual location

Timely reporting or reporting while in progress may allow a nearby RCMP unit in the immediate area to respond in a more expedient manner or may provide additional information to the detachment regarding a pending investigation.
