

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ROSSER

BY-LAW NO. 9 - 14

Being a By-Law to establish appropriation to the General Reserve Fund for the years 2015 through 2017 for the purchase of a 2014 Pumper Tanker Fire Truck.

WHEREAS, The Municipal Act, S.M. 1996, c.58 – Cap. M225 provides in part as follows:

168 (1) “A Council may by by-law establish reserve funds for any general or specific purpose.”

AND WHEREAS, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Rosser wishes to purchase a Tanker Pumper Fire Truck estimated at \$400,000 to be located in the Rosser CentrePort area of the Municipality, to be used for the whole municipality;

AND WHEREAS, \$185,000 will be contributed from the Fire Equipment Reserve Fund for the purchase, with the balance of \$215,000 coming from the General Reserve Fund;

AND WHEREAS, the Council wishes to augment the General Reserve Fund in the amount of \$215,000, over the next three (3) years, 2015 through 2017.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Rural Municipality of Rosser in open council assembled enacts as follows:

1. **THAT** an appropriation be made to augment the General Reserve Fund as follows:
 - a. In the Year 2015 – Seventy One Thousand Six Hundred and Sixty Six Dollars and Sixty Seven Cents (\$71,666.67);
 - b. In the Year 2016 – Seventy One Thousand Six Hundred and Sixty Six Dollars and Sixty Seven Cents (\$71,666.67); and
 - c. In the Year 2017 – Seventy Four Thousand Six Hundred and Sixty Six Dollars and Sixty Six Cents (\$71,666.66).
2. **THAT** the funds used to augment the Reserve be levied on all the taxable property in the Rural Municipality of Rosser according to the latest revised assessment in each year of this by-law.

DONE AND PASSED as a by-law of The Rural Municipality of Rosser at 0 077 E PR 221, Rosser in the Province of Manitoba this 8th day of July, A.D. 2014.
